

The Year in Review

Clayton State University's thirty-eighth year was one of growth and achievement. Three new buildings are currently under construction and slated to be open in August 2008. These three buildings include a new Residence Hall with all of the amenities for 441 students, a Student Activity Center, and a new School of Business building. The School of Business building will house faculty, a capstone business laboratory, and the Small Business Development Center. All three buildings will add considerable space for students. A new outdoor amphitheatre near Swan Lake will provide space for student productions as well as a nice place to enjoy the beauty of the campus.

This past year marked many academic firsts for the University:

August 2007 -- American Bar Association accreditation approval for associate degree and post baccalaureate certificate programs in Paralegal Studies.

August 2007 - Board of Regents approves a new Baccalaureate degree in Sociology

August 2007 -- Clayton State Holds Groundbreaking Ceremony for Student Housing and Activities Center

September 2007 – Clayton State School of Nursing Awarded Two Grants from the Department of Health and Human Services Health Resources and Services Administration totaling \$255,746 (annually).

September 2007 – Clayton State Student Body Named "Most Diverse" for the Fifth Time in *U.S. News & World Report's* America's Best Colleges

October 2007 - Faculty/Staff Fund Drive Raises \$97,000 with 96% Participation Rate

October 2007 -- School of Nursing Simulation Lab Opens

December 2007 -- Clayton State Dedicates Clayton State University - Fayette

December 2007 -- Clayton State School of Business Dean Ernest "Bud" Miller Retires after ten years

January 2008 -- Dr. Jacob Chacko appointed as the new dean in the School of Business

February 2008 -- Dr. Rodger Bates begins as the new dean in the College of Professional Studies

May 2008 -- Letter of intent submitted to the Board of Regents for a Bachelor of Science in Computer Science



Clayton State University's Center for Continuing Education served a total of 23,200 adults and youth in the Southern Crescent and North Fulton County during FY 2008. 7,000 adults and youth attended classes, workshops and conferences and 16,300 adults received workforce education, training and support services to enable them to enter the workforce or improve their skills to obtain new jobs.

In addition, contract training was provided to employees with the following companies: Owens Brockway- Welding, Department of Aviation- Literacy, Fresh Express- Management, Clayton Co. Public Schools, Dept. of Transportation- Leadership, Coca Cola-Event Planning, and Henry Medical Center-Leadership/Management.











Retention of First-Time, Full-Time Freshmen
