Coach Barfield Comments On The First Season

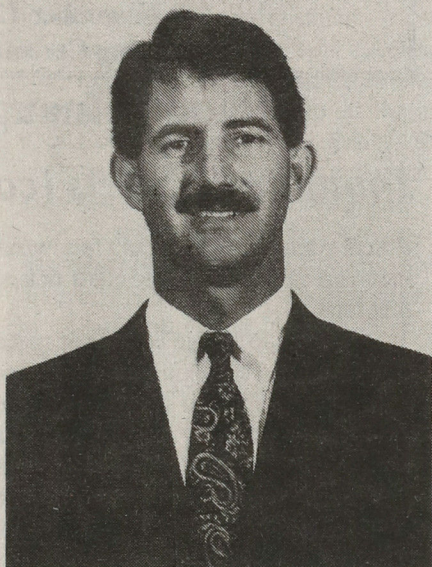

As the inaugural basketball season approaches at Clayton State College, many questions that the students and community may have about the program may still remain unanswered. Mr. Mason Barfield, Athletic Director and Head Basketball Coach, was interviewed to provide the answers for some of these questions.

Barfield began coaching at his alma mater, Lowndes High, in 1980. At Lowndes, Barfield was an assistant varsity coach and head junior varsity coach. Barfield traveled north to Cobb County's Lassiter High in 1985 to begin a three-year stint as the head coach of the varsity squad. He had a career record of 47-30 at Lassiter and was voted Cobb County's "Coach of the Year" in 1987.

Beginning in 1988, Barfield spent one season as the assistant men's basketball coach at Kennesaw State College. That season, he helped guide them into the NAIA district 25 playoffs. It was on October 10, 1989, that Dr. Downs named Mason Barfield as Clayton State Col-

lege's first Director of Athletics and Head Men's Basketball Coach.



The Lakers will begin their first season as a member of the NAIA district 25. Both Coach Barfield and Assistant

Coach Jeff Ozment, have coached within district 25 recently, the latter when he was an assistant at Berry College. Despite their knowledge of their opponents, Coach Barfield believes that the Lakers will be at a disadvantage in experience and size.

"We have twelve players eligible to play this year," Barfield said. "We

have nine of them that will be eligible to play before Christmas because three of them are transfers that have to sit out sixteen weeks before they can be eligible. One of the guys that has to sit out is probably one of our more experienced big men, Jay Booth," Barfield added. How- (See Coach's Comments on page)

Free Tickets To Be Given To Students, Faculty And Staff Members

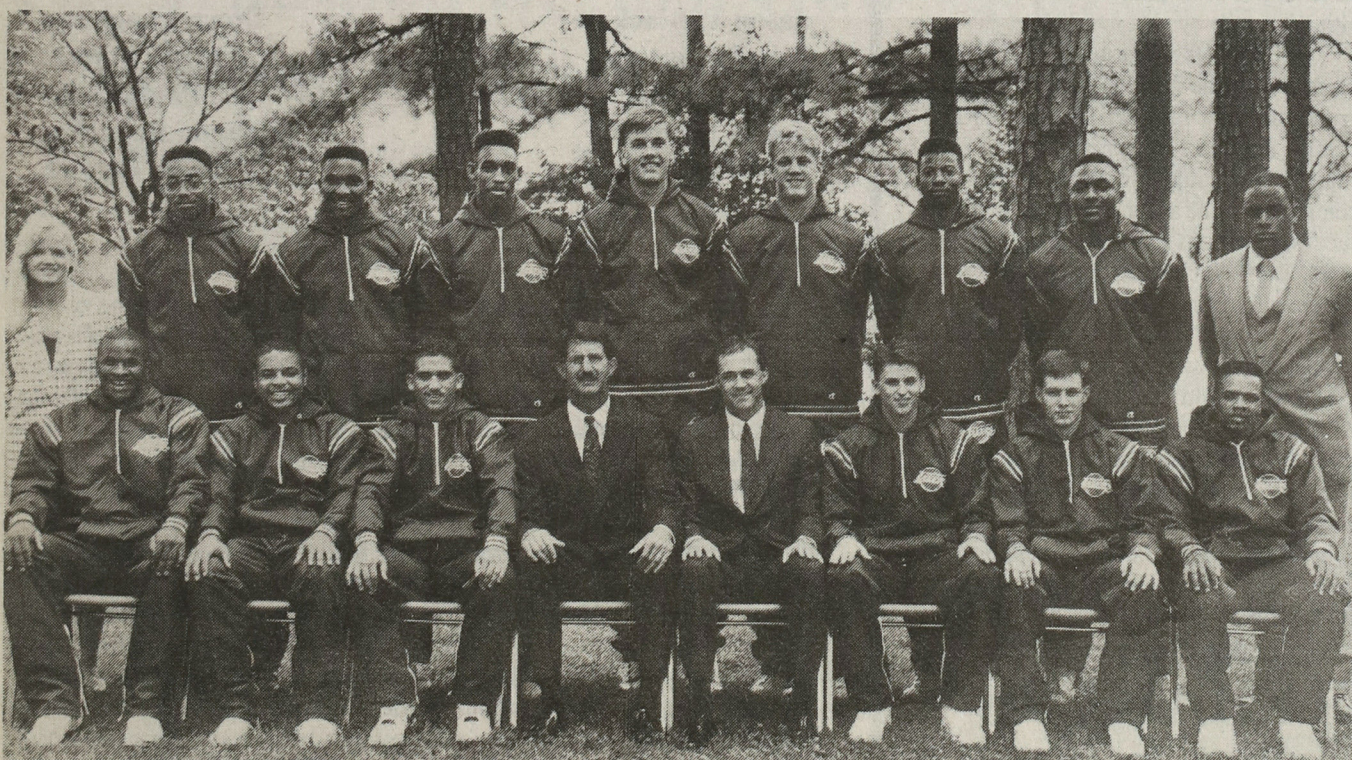

Attention! The tradition is about to begin. Don't miss this once in a life time event. Come watch the Clayton State Lakers, in their first game ever, take on

the Piedmont College Lions. Free general admission tickets for this season opening game will be available in the C-lobby next week.

From November 5 through November 9, free tickets will be available to the first 600 students, faculty, and staff from 9:30 a.m. to 1:15 p.m. Evening students may claim a ticket on November 5-8 from 5:15 to 6:15 p.m. and 7:45 to 8:30 p.m. During these hours, students presenting current validated Clayton State ID cards and faculty or staff members presenting Clayton State ID cards will get one free ticket to the inaugural game.

After November 7 the ticket situation will be evaluated. Any remaining tickets will be made available beginning Thursday, November 8 and continuing through Monday, November 12. In less than two weeks, the Clayton State basketball team will embark upon a journey into the unknown. On November 12, the Lakers will begin a tradition that will carry on for years to come. Coach Mason Barfield had a strong recruiting year last year as he signed a very talented group of players. For this reason, excitement fills the air across the campus.

Several Clayton State students were willing to share their enthusiasm with us. Several students were asked the following question:

"Are you excited about the upcoming season?"

Some of the responses made by the students follow:

"Yeah," said Mary Wright, a junior, "I'm going to watch them play as much as possible. I hope we have a good

ever, Barfield insisted that size won't be as much of a disadvantage as experience. The disadvantage occurs when a team comprised mainly of freshmen has to compete with a team of juniors and seniors who have been playing together for three or four years.

When asked whether or not the Lakers would feature a run and gun style of offense, Barfield indicated that he liked a fast-paced game. "I like to run it," Barfield explained, "but in our situation it's going to be subject to who we play, especially until our people learn our system well and feel comfortable with it. We're just going to try to play a style of play that is going to give us the best chance to win. Some nights that's going to be running, some nights that's going to be slowing it down." Barfield also mentioned that he has some players who can shoot the three-pointer.

Barfield noted that his two keys to victory are rebounding and defense. "The more rebounds you get, the more possessions you create. The more possessions a team has," he explained, "the more

chances a team has to score points." Defensively, Barfield simply requests that his players control their effort. If the players exercise control on defense, they can put themselves in position to create rebounding opportunities, scoring opportunities, and ultimately, victory opportunities.

Barfield suggested that he is very pleased with the development of the program and with the way the players are coming together. He expects tremendous support from students, faculty, and the community. The area has had outstanding success in various sports at the high school level. Barfield believes that this will help generate interest in the Lakers.

Coach Barfield worked his way around the question of how many games the Lakers would win this year. "We have 27 games to win and 27 games to lose," he said. "We're going to play every game to win, but what I want from my players this year is for them to improve with every game." So let's go out and support the Lakers this year and watch them improve from game to game.

Assistant Coach Ozment Helps With Lakers Development

Mr. Jeff Ozment, 28, who led his Gilmer County High School team into the state tournament last year, has returned to the college coaching ranks as assistant coach at Clayton State College.



Head Coach Mason Barfield was particularly pleased to have someone of Jeff's abilities and background to join the Lakers during Clayton State's inaugural basketball season. Ozment demonstrated, both during his playing and coaching days at Berry College and as a high school coach, that he has the personality

to communicate with young people.

After making all-area basketball and baseball teams at Cave Spring High School, Ozment was awarded a full athletic scholarship to attend Berry College in Rome. He made good the opportunity by becoming a four-year letterman with the Vikings, and served as team captain during his senior year.

Ozment began his coaching career as a junior varsity coach at Berry College in 1985. After two seasons there, he became head coach at Glennville High School in south Georgia, coaching both junior varsity and varsity teams. A year later, he began a two-year stint at Gilmer High in Ellijay, and directed his 1989-90 team to a 17-9 record and to the Region 8AA North Championship. Ranked 9th in Georgia, his team lost to top-ranked East Rome in the state tournament.

Jeff's wife, Sandra, also was a basketball player at Berry College. Sandra graduated from Johnson High School in Gainesville and Truett-McConnell College in Cleveland, before earning a bachelor's degree in business administration from Berry.

In 1986, she was named to the first team NAIA All-American Basketball team and to the Kodak All-American Basketball team. In addition, she was honored by the Atlanta Tip-Off Club as Georgia's NAIA Player of the Year.

Jeff and Sandra have been married three years.

The Tradition Begins: How Basketball Came To CSC

When Clayton State College converted to a four-year institution in 1986, steps were considered to enter the College into intercollegiate athletic competition.

A special student/faculty committee, formed to study athletics, found an overwhelming desire by students, faculty and community members to pursue the issue. Eventually, the decision was made to field a men's basketball team, to be followed by other sports.

Mr. H. Mason Barfield was hired as Director of Athletics and head basketball coach in October, 1989, and immediately began the task of recruiting players for his first team, developing a schedule and making necessary alterations to the existing gymnasium to accommodate basketball.

Men's basketball competition will be followed by a women's basketball program during the 1991-92 season. Other additions to the sports program, suggested in a student survey, include cross country, softball and tennis for women, and cross country, baseball, soccer and golf for men. Decisions on the addition of such programs will be made after studies are completed to determine their impact on the College and the community.

Clayton State's first basketball team will compete in District 25 of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). The Lakers will also be the newest member in the Georgia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GIAC). They will play a 27 game schedule during the inaugural season.

The hats have been ordered and he hopes that they will be available for purchase by the November 12 game.

In addition to the soft goods that you have recently seen on the racks in the bookstore, a new gray Lakers sweatshirt is on order. A limited edition inaugural game t-shirt should also be ready for sale, possibly as soon as November 5, the date that the free general admission tickets will first be distributed.

You Can Claim Free Tickets For Other Lakers Home Games In The PE Building

Beginning November 15, tickets for all Laker home games will be available at the PE building lobby ticket booth prior to each game. Students presenting a current validated Clayton State ID card and faculty/staff presenting a Clayton State ID card can claim a free general admission ticket for home games.

If desired, a free general admission guest ticket can also be claimed at that time. Children under 12 will be admitted for free. Persons between the ages of 13 and 18 can purchase general admission tickets for \$1.00 and those 18 and over, who are non-CSC students can purchase general admission tickets for \$3.00.

Reserved seats, with fold-up seat backs will sell for \$5.00 at each game. Reserved seat season passes will be available to students for \$35.00. Faculty and staff reserved seat season tickets will sell for \$45.00. Reserved seats for the public will cost \$52.00. There will be about 100 reserved seats available for purchase for each home game. Season tickets may be purchased at E-47, Coach Barfield's office.
