Lady Lakers Embark On Inaugural Season

Women's intercollegiate athletics at Clayton State College will be ushered in with the inaugural Lady Lakers basketball team. Veteran college coach Lynn Jarrett, 164-130 in 11 seasons at North Georgia and Tennessee Wesleyan, has the challenge of assembling a competitive team in tough NAIA District 25.

Jarrett has assembled a team mixed with young players from successful high school programs and mature players with college experience. This first Lady Lakers' squad will face a challenging schedule of conference and district foes, as well as NCAA opponents.

A key characteristic of this inaugural team is that its players are home-grown. Of the 12 players who will be eligible this season, eight hail from Clayton County. Of the remaining four, three played high school ball in the metro Atlanta area.

Jarrett will be relying on those (See Lady Lakers on page 5)

PROFILES OF THE COACHES

H. Mason Barfield, Director of Athletics and Lakers Coach

H. Mason Barfield begins his second season as head coach of the Clayton State College basketball Lakers. He and the College experienced an exciting, yet rocky, inaugural season as the Lakers posted a 3-24 record.

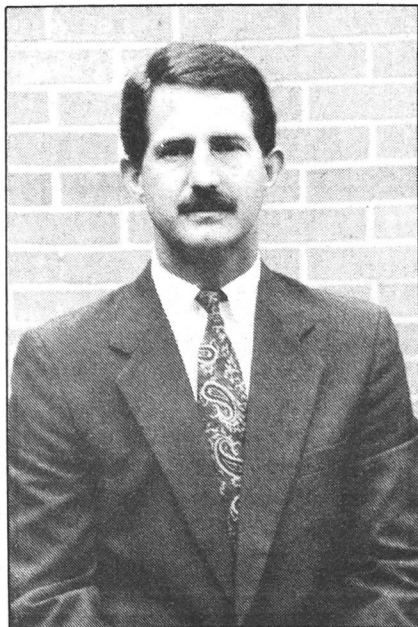
Barfield was named Clayton State's Director of Athletics and men's head basketball coach in October of 1989. He began his coaching career in 1980 as an assistant varsity coach and head junior varsity coach at his alma mater, Lowndes High School.

He moved on to Lassiter High School in 1985 and compiled a 47-30 record during three seasons as men's head basketball coach at the Cobb County school. During his second season, his team produced a 17-7 record, the first winning season in Lassiter's history. In 1987-88, his last season there, Barfield's team posted a 23-7 record en route to the State AAAA semifinals where they lost to eventual state champion Griffin. He was named "coach of the year" in Cobb County following the season.

He served as assistant men's basketball coach at Kennesaw State College during the 1988-89 season, helping guide the team to an 18-13 record and into the NAIA District 25 playoffs.

Barfield holds both a Bachelor of Science and Master's Degree in health and physical education from Valdosta State College. Married for 15 years, he and his wife, Elizabeth, have three children: Josh, 13; Ryan, 10; and Jess, 5.

Clayton State College prides itself in its reputation of academic excellence. Rarely, students have the opportunity to exhibit their classroom skills



before a crowd of onlookers. However, intercollegiate athletics provide an arena, before hundreds or thousands of spectators, to extend not only one's physical skills, but also one's mental skills.

Last year, Clayton State embarked on a new adventure with the start of intercollegiate athletics. We began a tradition, through men's basketball, which unified students, faculty, staff, and the community.

This year, we build on this tradition with the addition of women's basketball and golf. In the years to come, we plan to add several more sports which will represent Clayton State in athletic competitions. By offering a variety of intercollegiate sports, we are not only providing more students with an opportunity to excel outside the classroom, we are also providing the opportunity for college and community to bond.

I wish our athletic teams well during the upcoming year and extend an invitation to our community to become a part of our "growing tradition."

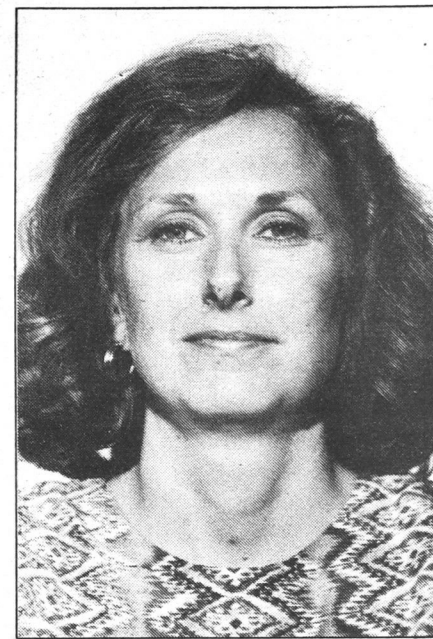
Lynn Jarrett, Lady Lakers Coach

After nine seasons as head coach of the Lady Saints at North Georgia College, Lynn Jarrett has found a new home at Clayton State College. Jarrett has the challenge of starting a women's program from scratch.

Jarrett begins her 12th season of college coaching with an overall record of 164-130. She began her coaching career in 1980 at Tennessee Wesleyan College in Athens, Tenn. She guided Tennessee Wesleyan to consecutive 16-8 records and the Eastern Volunteer State Conference title in 1982.

Jarrett, a graduate of North Georgia College, returned to her alma mater in 1982. During the 1984-85 season, Jarrett guided North Georgia to a 15-13 record, the best mark for a Lady Saints team since 1975.

After a 13-12 season the following year, Jarrett and North Georgia hit pay dirt in 1986-87. The Lady Saints ended the season as the NAIA's second best team with a 27-4 record. North Georgia also captured District 25 and Bi-District XI titles. For her efforts, Jarrett was named NAIA District 25 Coach of the



Year. The following year, she was inducted into the Georgia Sports Hall of Fame.

Jarrett holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in physical education and Master's Degree in education.

Jeff Ozment, Assistant Men's Coach

Assistant Coach Jeff Ozment, 29, begins his second season at Clayton State. Head Coach Mason Barfield selected Ozment as his assistant because of his demonstrated experience as a player and coach.

Ozment was an all-area basketball and baseball player at Cave Spring High School. He received a full athletic scholarship to attend Berry College in Rome and made good of the opportunity by becoming a four-year letterman with the Vikings.

After earning his bachelor degree in physical education, Ozment began his coaching career as a junior varsity coach at Berry in 1985. After two seasons there, he became head coach at Glennville High School in south Georgia, coaching both junior varsity and varsity teams. A



year later, Ozment began a two-year stint at Gilmer County High in Ellijay. He directed his 1989-90 team to a 17-9 record and to the Region 8-AA North Championship. Ranked ninth in Class AA, his team lost to top-ranked East Rome in the state tournament.

Ozment also earned a master's degree in physical education from North Georgia College. He will be taking on a new challenge this spring when he will coach Clayton State's first intercollegiate golf team.

Ozment is married to the former Sandra Tanner, who was also a star basketball player at Berry. In 1986, she was a first team NAIA and Kodak All-American. She was also honored by the Atlanta Tip-Off Club as Georgia's NAIA Player of the Year. She works for the Office of Continuing Education at Clayton State.

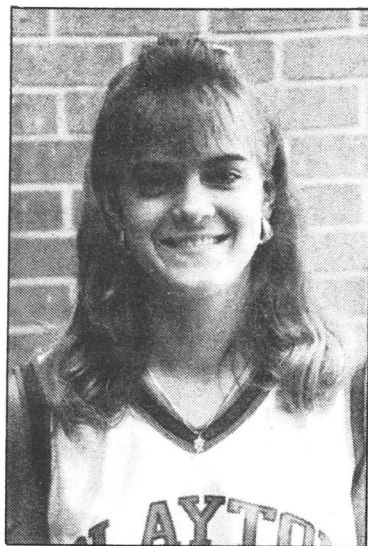
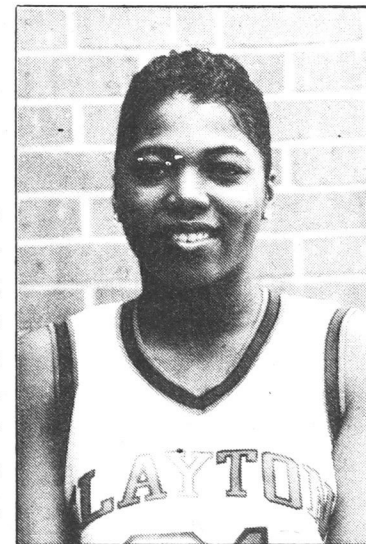

How Our Team Became The Lakers

The selection of the Lakers to represent Clayton State College athletic teams was no easy task.

A special committee appointed by College President, Dr. Harry S. Downs, coordinated the six-month selection process. Suggestions were sought to symbolize what Clayton State represents, including its excellence in academics and the natural beauty of the campus. A list of 104 suggestions was made by students, faculty and staff, and members of the community.

The elimination of names identical with local high schools, Georgia colleges on Clayton State's schedule, or oth-

ers within the University System of Georgia shortened the list of possibilities from the start.

Lakers was first suggested because of the natural beauty of the Clayton State campus, built around a 12-acre lake and two other smaller lakes. In the end, it was selected as the natural choice because it best describes the visual effect that the campus has within the community.

A Review Of The Inaugural Year

Going into last year's inaugural season, Mason Barfield knew it would be tough for his young Lakers, made up mostly of freshmen. The squad began its start in dramatic fashion before a packed home crowd against Piedmont College on November 12, 1990. The result was an exciting 70-65 loss to the Lions.

The Lakers would not taste sweet victory until the eighth game of the season. On December 5 against an offensively aggressive DeVry Institute, the Lakers earned their historic first victory, an 80-70 decision. Norris Brantley led the assault with 26 points and five assists. Carlos Head pulled down 10 rebounds.

However, the Lakers experienced a long string of losses -- 12 to be exact -- before they would earn another win. In

between, the squad improved on defense and played in some close ballgames. The Lakers earned their second win of the season -- and first District 25 win -- against LaGrange College on February 9, 1991. Less than a week later, the team won its third game of the season, this time an 89-72 win on DeVry's home court.

The Lakers ended the season with a dissatisfying 3-24 mark. Carlos Head finished the season as the Lakers' top scorer (17.4 ppg). He was selected to the District 25 All-Freshman Team.

The Outlook For The Lakers' Second Season Is Optimistic

The Lakers look for much improvement over last season's 3-24 record. Nine players return from last season's squad while nine new faces have been added.

Coach Mason Barfield has the team working at improving in two areas -- man-to-man defense and offensive conversion. The Lakers averaged 70.5 ppg while allowing 81.1 ppg.

Heading the returnees from last year's team is sophomore Carlos Head. The 6-1 guard/forward led the Lakers with 17.4 ppg and was named to the NAIA District 25 All-Freshman Team. Also back are 6-0 sophomore guard Matt Bowen (6.9 ppg); 6-9 sophomore center Jay Booth (9.6 ppg); 6-2 junior forward Vern Chinn (3.9 ppg); 6-6 sophomore forward Paul Reid (4.3 ppg); 6-0 sophomore guard Adrian Stevens (13.8 ppg); 6-1 junior guard Barrett Hoard (7.6 ppg); 6-3 sophomore forward Pat Lee (5.2 ppg); and 6-8 sophomore center Steve Wilson (0.4 ppg).

Laker newcomers are expected to make a significant impact. They are led by 6-5 sophomore forward Bruce Oglesby, a transfer from Tennessee Tech. Oglesby started eight games last season, averaged 11.5 ppg and was named to the Ohio Valley Conference's All-Rookie Team.

Others include 6-3 junior Eric Boazman; 6-0 freshman William Bowen; 6-3 junior Dexter Brown; 6-3 freshman Ron Burdekin; 6-3 junior David Viti; 6-5 sophomore Keith Herring; 6-6 freshman Jeff Rogers; and 6-5 sophomore Bobby Chappell.

The Lakers Affiliations: Information About The NAIA & GIAC

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) is a completely autonomous association currently administering intercollegiate athletics programs to nearly 500 fully-accredited colleges and universities throughout the United States and Canada. The Association is organized into 32 geographic districts.

Established in 1940 as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball

(NAIB), the Association emanated from the "National Small College Basketball Tournament" inaugurated in 1937 in Kansas City, Mo.

Approximately 80,000 student-athletes compete annually in NAIA-sanctioned varsity athletics programs. Comprising of approximately 40 percent of all four-year collegiate athletics programs offered in the U.S., the Association administers 23 separate championships covering 13 sports.

The conversion of the NAIB to the NAIA came in 1952 when the Association added national championships in golf, tennis and outdoor track and field. Baseball, cross country, football, and swimming and diving were added to the championship calendar in 1956. More recent additions include indoor track and field, soccer, softball, volleyball and wrestling.

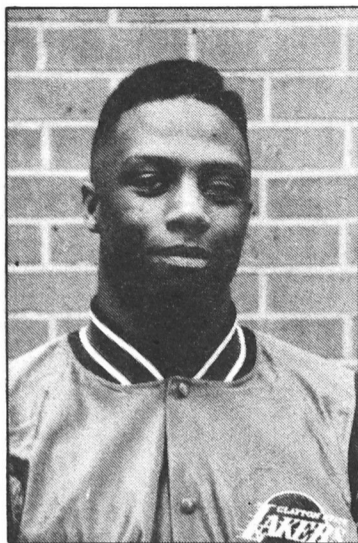
The GIAC

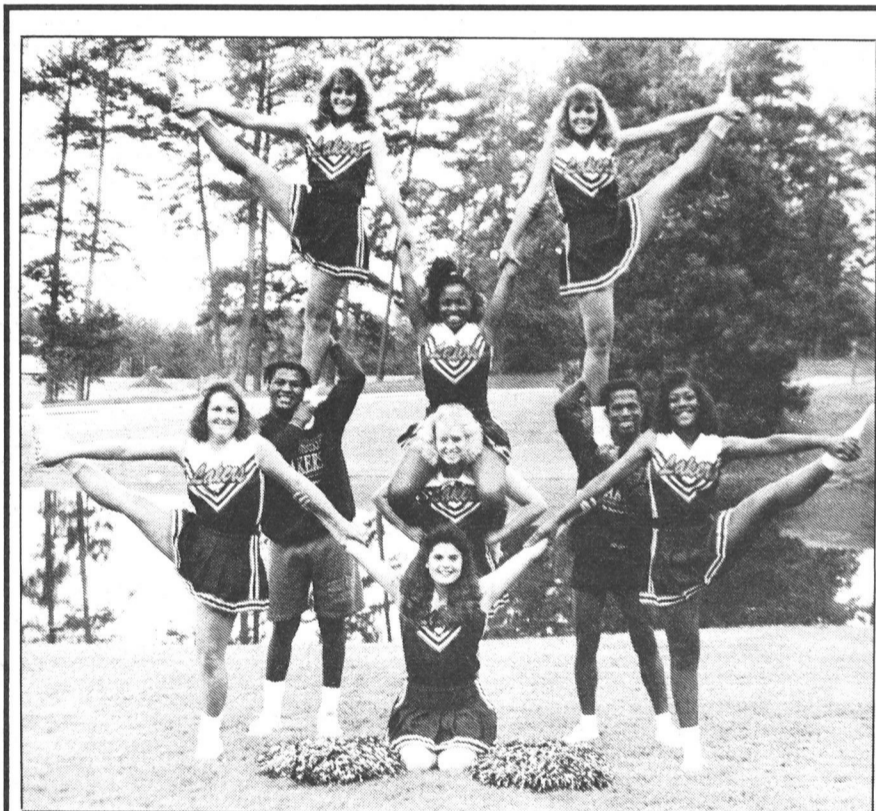
