Currently, there are about 1,080 two-year colleges enrolling nearly 2.5 million students. By 1975 the number of institutions is expected to increase to 1,225 with an enrollment of 5 million students. Junior College enrollment now accounts for 25 percent of all those attending colleges and universities."
